When you call 211, a trained information and referral specialist will listen to your situation and help you find the services you need. They provide information on child care, language classes, job searches, housing, health services, family counseling, services for seniors, emergency shelters, services for persons with disabilities, home support, legal assistance, financial assistance, volunteer opportunities, social and recreational programs, services for newcomers to Canada and much more. 211 is an important number to remember and we welcome it to Simcoe County.
