#### NEW POLICY

For "no charge" or "pay as you go" events (i.e. bowling, Batteaux Creek golf day, OPP and Leacock Museum tours) a deposit of \$10.00 cash per person will be required in the future, to hold your place at sign-up. This will be considered a REFUNDABLE DEPOSIT. The money will be returned to you once you attend or arrive at the scheduled event. If you do not attend, the money is non-refundable!

Due to the difficulty of forecasting the number of members who will attend a ticketed event, you can no longer sign-up for an event without paying by cheque the full amount owing for the event, at the time of sign-up.

If you have signed up for an event and have not yet paid, you must pay now or your name will come off the list. Only the people that have paid for events will be considered signed-up


Our next breakfast will be on Wednesday, July 26, 2017, 9:00AM at Yammas Grill.




#### Happy Bookers
