AUGUST 19TH. EVENT

Wednesday August 19th is the scheduled date for a wonderfully exciting performance of "Footloose" at the Kings Wharf Theatre, 97 Jury Dr., Penetanguishene. Show time is 2:00 pm., so make sure that you give yourself plenty of time to get to the theatre. I believe the travel time is around 1 hour. There are 65 Beachcombers members who will be attending. The tickets for this performance will be available for you to pick up at the social table during the August meeting...so make sure that you attend.

SEPTEMBER EVENT

Monday, September 28th is the date schedule for our Car Rally / Poker Run. So far we have 39 people who signed up. We will meet at the RecPlex at 11:30 am., with vehicles scheduled to depart at 12:00 noon. The route will take you to 4 stops along the way where you will be required to leave the vehicle and proceed on foot for a short period of time, so make sure that you wear appropriate footwear. You will also be required to take photos so make sure you have at least one camera in each vehicle. There will be a quiz for the first and second portions of the rally. Regarding the Poker Run....each vehicle will select 1 card from deck at each of the 4 stops, plus a fifth card at the rally end. The vehicle with the best poker hand will be awarded a prize. The Rally is estimated to take between 5 - 5 ½ hours to complete including the required stops. At the completion of the rally we will be having dinner. You will find out where once you have arrived at the end.


ROMEO (MEN'S) BREAKFAST GROUP

FIRST EDITION BOOK REVIEW

The Book Thief by Marcus Zusak takes place in the fear filled years of Nazi Germany during 1939-1943. Not your typical WWII story, the book has a very unusual narrator, 'The Grim Reaper' throughout, but it is not morbid. We are first introduced to Liesel, a young girl and her foster mother and father who reside in a small, poor, German village. The story is rich with well developed characters who play an important part in her life. Liesel loves books and becomes a book thief, stealing books from many sources, even though initially she is unable to read and write. This is a story so rich with characters of all ages it is appealing to a broad spectrum of readers. We are exposed to those inside and outside the Nazi party, some caught in the middle during those horrendous years, many who are unable to replace ignorance with knowledge. Zusak's writing is beautifully lyrical, haunting and

poetic throughout the book. The power of language continually paints a visual landscape for the reader, so much so, that many have said they can't put the book down. However, this is a book to savour slowly, a story that is both heart-warming and heartbreaking at the same time. One reviewer made this comment: "If you love to read, love to care about the characters, love to eat words like they're ice cream, love to have your heart broken and mended on the same page, then this book is for you"

'The First Edition' recommends this novel, and gave it a 4.25 rating.
